### Show and Tell

In recent times, Bob Whitworth has been one of our most consistent contributors to the Show and Tell segment of our meetings and he came through again in August.

Bob brought in a creatively designed and nicely implemented Display Rack. The design concept was for a display rack that could be easily assembled and disassembled, without tools, and would not mar the surface of the table on which it is placed. The rack is something that could be used at craft shows or garage sales for display of items like artwork that look better in a vertical orientation.



Here are some details about the piece from Bob:


- There are two clips made of wood with t-nuts in each to make it secure to the table. They are intended only to be tightened by hand so as not to damage the table.

## MEETING HIGHLIGHTS *(Continued from page 1)*

- The horizontal runner slips into a T-Slot and has a hole cut in each end so that when a wedge is installed in each it binds like a stretcher on a harvest table.



- One side of the display has a wooden curtain rod installed to display items like a folded quilt.
- The other half of the rack is two back-to-back panels of 1/4" peg board. The two peg-boards are held about 3/4" apart by the top runner so that hooks can be inserted into the peg boards on each side.
- The outside face of the outer standards have random 1/4" holes drilled along the edge so pegs can be inserted to display articles. All holes are drilled at a 30 degree angle to help the pegs hold the article placed on them.

Great work, Bob!
