Highlights From the March Meeting

The March meeting was an open forum round table discussion.

Val Tuck gave an informative presentation on his technique for making and installing wide, compound crown moldings. He recently completed such a project. To complicate matters, the molding included recessed lighting so all joints had to be "light tight."

There was a good discussion about types of finishes to use on kitchen cabinets. Val noted that a conversion varnish is the most durable but it takes good safety precautions to use it. It is a spray-type finish. **Joe Doker** mentioned Sherwin-Williams CAB Acrylic lacquer has good non-yellowing properties. As for painted cabinets, Val has used acrylic enamel with good success. He suggested using Sherwin-Williams bonding primer under the enamel.

Roger Walton spoke about a sanding dust collector he recently got called a Dust Deputy, by Oneida. After two months he is very pleased with it.

Austin asked for suggestions about how to cut about 1" off of his kitchen counter to change his range from a drop in to a free-standing type. Several members had experience with this task and offered a number of suggestions. We'll have to check with Austin at the next meeting and see how he made out.

There was a discussion about planer blades for the DeWalt Planer. Spencer has found a good source for replacement blades that far exceed the original blades provided. He also passed on a neat suggestion for the situation where you slightly nick the blades thus causing a small raised “bead” on subsequent passes. Instead of changing the blades, or flipping them over for double-edged blades, he suggests sliding one blade slightly to the left, another slightly to the right, and leave the third in place. This will sometimes solve the problem and allow you to get additional use out of your planer blades.
